- a. Steve Talburt moved to table Emergency Management budget for one week- Jerry Roberts, explained that they had two changes, raises for the girls in the office and \$2,500.00 capital outlay. He mentioned that they may get reimbursed through some grants. Charlie Cartwright mentioned that he'd like all departments to see what they can reduce out of their budgets. Anthony Hudson second the motion. Hudson-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.
- b. Anthony Hudson moved to approve E-911 budget- Kay Kelley, explained that they can reduce their M&O \$9,000.00 and travel down \$1,000.00. \$10,000.00 will be reduced all together. Steve Talburt second the motion. Hudson-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.
- c. Steve Talburt moved to table OSU Extension budget- Rick Clovis, mentioned that they are asking for an increase for a FCS person. It will improve the extension program all together and he'd like to grow the 4-H program. He also requested more travel money. Anthony Hudson second the motion. Hudson-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.

Anthony Hudson moved to approve the Tourism budget: Mary Beth mentioned that last year they went over budget for events. There was a reduction from last year. Salaries have not changed and they are cutting travel down. The event submissions were reduced \$1,500.00. They removed what we could to stay at \$30,000.00 per month and cut \$70,000.00 from our budget all together. Steve Talburt second the motion. Hudson-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Under citizens' input, Jerry Butterbaugh mentioned he had 3 questions. Jerry Butterbaugh: On item 12, did those benefit premiums go up? Christina Talburt: It did go up \$1:96 and it's based on the highest premiums. Butterbaugh: A lot is paid by Air BNB on lodging taxes for overnight lodging right? Cartwright: Yes, the taxes paid go to tourism. Butterbaugh: Does the county get a list of who pays overnight lodging taxes? I suspect there may be a number of cheaters that don't pay overnight lodging taxes. Cartwright: That would be a Mary Beth question. Butterbaugh: The third question is close and dear to my heart and is what Steve asked earlier about 4-H, money, and events. Do you think something like the Ralston Fairfax 4-H and people raising money, does what you said change that? Rick Clovis: The booster club no. That money doesn't go through the extension. The 4-H club sometimes comes through us. Butterbaugh: So that would be affected? Clovis: Yes, the 4-H will be affected I would say.
