Dusty Birdsong, ACCO, presented the Board with information regarding the County Deductible Fund. Birdsong stated the deductible fund has been fully funded for the past two years and the deductible is \$100,000 this Fiscal Year. Birdsong stated once the County reaches the second deductible or uses the \$100,000 in the deductible fund; the County does not have a deductible anymore. Birdsong added it is never a good idea to pay outside of the deductible. The program is here to protect the County. Birdsong elaborated that car wrecks can easily chew up the deductible. Everett Piper stated his questions have been answered. Sally Hulse inquired if the County uses the complete deductible account if the claims will still be paid or asked if claims would be rejected. Birdsong stated the County's claims will never be rejected. Birdsong also added the reason for the increased premium is largely due to

Everett Piper moved to approve the use of the County Deductible Fund 2023/2024 for total loss to the Sheriff's vehicle in the amount of \$50,090.00 that occurred on January 4, 2024, to 2023 Ford Vin #1FM5K8AB3PG80163. Steve Talburt seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried. (#26909)

Everett Piper moved to approve the use of the County Deductible Fund 2022/2023 for roof replacement for the Health Department where the replacement cost is \$61,914.12 less depreciation is \$22,405.23 and the actual cash value is \$39,508.69. Steve Talburt seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried. (#26910)

Steve Talburt moved to set County Free Dump Day for April 20, 2024. Everett Piper seconded the motion. Piperyes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.

Steve Talburt moved to accept all bids for Tabulation for Bid #24-13 New and Updated Sound System for Fairgrounds. Charlie Cartwright announced bids from Miller Pro AVL for \$66,160.89 (#26911), Warner Audio Video LLC for \$52,875.00 (#26912), Video Reality for \$60,149.57 (#26913), and VSC Fire and Security for \$86,446.19 (#26914). Everett Piper seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.

Everett Piper moved to approve and sign Planned Maintenance Agreement for the Sheriff with Clifford Power for \$1,514.00 for all preventative maintenance inspections on a semi-annual basis. Everett Piper stated he confirmed with Gary Upton and Dalton Higgins this agreement does not overlap with the Deferred Maintenance Plan. Steve Talburt seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried. (#26915)

Steve Talburt moved to table quote with Offender Watch for \$6,500 for annual fee for Sheriff. Gary Upton stated both legal teams are still working on specific verbiage of contract. Everett Piper seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.

Steve Talburt moved to approve the use of \$28,000 balance from original District #3 Shop allocation. Charlie Cartwright stated out of the allocated money for the District #3 shop, there is a balance of \$28,000 and asked the Board for approval to use the \$28,000 to complete the current District #3 Shop Building. Cartwright stated they made a mistake along the way with the building not having gutters and have also had issues with the air compression not working as the current plan calls for the use of the existing compressor in the old building. Cartwright stated he would come before the Board for any new issues that will need to be fixed that are going to be paid from the \$28,000. Everett Piper seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried. (#26916)

Everett Piper moved to approve and sign Interlocal with Fairfax instead of signing a contract with Survival Flight EMS for Services for the Town of Fairfax for \$5,500/month. Charlie Cartwright stated he is aware of what's in the contract and doesn't think they need to mess with it at this point. Cartwright stated he has spoken with Ashley Kane and a way to resolve this easily is to go ahead and pass a Resolution Interlocal Agreement. Everett Piper confirmed Cartwright desire to pass the Interlocal Agreement instead of the contract as stated per the agenda. Cartwright stated he doesn't think the contract is anything the County needs to get involved in. Piper inquired to ADA Kane if this is the route the County should take. Ashley Kane stated if there is already a contract with the Town of Fairfax, one contract is enough and to sign an Interlocal stating the County will cover some of the cost. Kane stated there is no reason for Fairfax and the County to be under contract. Steve Talburt seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.

Steve Talburt moved to approve payment of \$148,845.83 from the Contingency Account for Pictometry (Eagleview) bill. Steve Talburt inquired if the \$188,845.83 is the entire balance of bill or the amount after considering the \$40,000 for E911. Ed Quinton stated the \$188,845.83 is the whole bill and the \$40,000 would not be paid out of Contingency, but be paid by E911 as they budgeted the \$40,000 in the E911 2023/2024 budget. Talburt stated the payment from E911 would be \$40,000 and General \$148,845.83. Robin Slack inquired what specific General Government account the BOCC wanted to use to fund the Pictometry invoice. Slack stated this was the first year for the true rollover to be in a Contingency Account and the balance of the account is sitting at roughly \$2,600,000. Slack stated the 2050 account is the maintenance account for paying for the District #3 building, the 2020 account is paying for ambulance services, the 2005 account is paying for Courthouse supplies thus Slack had reached the conclusion there was not enough in any of these accounts to fund this invoice. Talburt







stated he would be fine using the Contingency Account. Everett Piper seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried. (#26918)

Everett Piper moved to approve and sign Agreement with Higgins Construction Management for inspections and opinions for listed addresses in Osage County for Forty-Two Thousand Two Hundred and Five Dollars and 00/100 (\$42,205). Everett Piper stated that this is the contract for the deferred maintenance schedule discussed three weeks prior. Higgins Construction will oversee this work with engineers and architects necessary to evaluate current County properties condition. Piper stated this analysis phase is needed to know what the County needs to spend money on to fix the buildings. Bud Beaston inquired how the \$42, 205 would be allocated between Dalton Higgins and other companies? Beaston also asked if Dalton Higgins is doing this work for 3-4 weeks; will he also be continuing his work for the County with the other contract in place. Beaston stated in a prior BOCC meeting Emblem Architect was brought up and he could not find any record this company ever existed. Piper stated that it was in error, the company name is in fact Ambler Architects. Beaston inquired if he could finish his question. Cartwright stated the BOCC were in the middle of voting. Beaston stated Cartwright needs to remember he works for him. Cartwright stated no he doesn't; he works for District #3. Beaston stated the Board together works for the people. Cartwright responded informing Beaston he was out of order and could take three minutes at the end. Dalton Higgins stated there are 26-28 structures and he is working with five firms. Beaston inquired how the \$42,000 will be split and how often this payment will be made. Higgins stated the payment would be split among several companies and it is a one-time payment as it is a one-time inspection that would give the County information to use for the next couple of years. Steve Talburt seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried. (#26919)

Steve Talburt moved to approve and sign Transfer for \$175,000 from Treasurer M&O (Account 1220-1-0600-2005) to Salaries (Account 1220-1-0600-1110). Everett Piper seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.

Everett Piper moved to approve and sign February Cash Fund Estimate of Needs (SAI 308) for 1102 Highway Receipts for \$596,005.58 and CBRI 1103 Highway Receipts for \$63,413.07. Steve Talburt seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.

During Citizen's Input, Kevin Harrison inquired why the county-employed maintenance worker could not do the maintenance at the Sheriff's Office. Charlie Cartwright stated it is specialized equipment that needs maintenance and the company hired are experts in this field. Bud Beaston inquired what the equipment is and Cartwright stated the generator for the entire Sheriff's Department. Beaston inquired why agenda item #20 did not go out for bid. Cartwright stated its personnel service and Everett Piper stated it did not have to go out for bid. Jerry Butterbaugh stated this would be an unusual Fiscal Year with the construction of the Annex affecting the Courthouse. Butterbaugh proposed the Board start scheduling different departments to give a 10–15 minute budget presentation to show routine expenditures and to see changes in budgets. Piper stated on October 10, 2023, the Board signed a Resolution for the budget process timeframe that sets the stage for the budget review the Board needs. Beaston inquired if item #20 records will be housed in the County Clerk's Office or District #1. Charlie Cartwright stated to check in the County Clerk's office first and if it is not there to check with the respective District.

Everett Piper moved to adjourn. Steve Talburt seconded the motion. Piper-yes; Talburt-yes; Cartwright-yes. Motion carried.
